Dear Rocky Hock Church Family,

As I write another article to you, it is hard to believe that February is upon us. January has been challenging, to say the least, with so many people being sick, experiencing the loss of loved ones, typical winter weather, and attempting to get back into the swing of things in a new year. February is the month that people customarily associate with love, as Valentine's Day is

approaching. We would not know what love is apart from the love of God. I remind you that God loves you. As we are studying the Ten Commandments in the series "New Year, New Revelation," God's love is evident. As God promised Moses (Exodus 3:12) that He was leading the Israelites out of Egypt in order that He might lead them unto Himself. It is a picture of His love for us so that we can understand what God does for all those who place their faith in Him. We were once in the bondage of sin and under the penalty of sin. However, God delivers us from being underneath the penalty of sin (Romans 3:22-25) through the atoning sacrifice of His Son, just as God delivered Israel by the Passover lamb. God gave the Israelites the promise of a land flowing with milk and honey just as God promises us a place called heaven. It is in heaven where God will ultimately save us from the presence of sin (Revelation 21:4). Until then, God is leading us in the wilderness of our sanctification. In our wandering God leads us to himself as He led the people of Israel to experience His revelation (Exodus 20). It is here that we learn of God, His nature, His character and His love. It is on the mountain of our experience with Him that He calls each of us to loyal obedience. This is why the first of the ten commands is to "have no other gods before Him" (Exodus 20:3). My prayer for all of us this year is that God's Word will lead us into abundant pastures to feed and rest. As your pastor, watching over you, I pray that you will know God's love as He leads you, feeds you, and protects you. God desires to protect us so that we can, "trust in the Lord, and do good; so you will live in the land, and enjoy security. Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart" (Psalm 37:3-4).

I remind you of G.K. Chesterton who lived in the early 20th century, is quoted to having said, "doctrine and discipline may be walls; but they are walls of a playground, Christianity." Since God is our Creator, He alone knows what will help us and hurt us in life. God lays out before us the ten things that will hurt us if we climb out over the walls and leave this beautiful playground that He alone has created. God will meet our most basic needs such as safety, security, food, shelter, and belongingness to Him and each other since we are God's family.

In closing, I want to make you aware that, "Lord willing," we will celebrate the Lord's Supper together on the 6th of February at 11:00 am. The observance of the Lord's Supper is a sacred time to ensure we are right with Him and with one another. It is a picture when all of us will be with Jesus in heaven celebrating the marriage supper of the Lamb (Revelation 19:6-9). We will have peace with God and one another. In our preparation of sharing this ordinance together, we are to ask God to search our hearts and for each person to "examine themselves" to ensure that we have peace in our relationship (vertically) with God and our relationships (horizontally) with each other. Think with me, God's grace leads to God's peace. As you prepare, ask yourself this question: How much peace do I have with God and with others?

May God help all of us to experience His Grace and Peace together.

Being Pro-life Calls for Advocacy and Action

As followers of Jesus Christ, the sanctity of human life is an issue that we can all stand united together on. Scripture tells us that all human beings are made in the image of God, are knit together in our mother's womb, and are fearfully and wonderfully made.

In 1984, former President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation declaring Sunday, January 22, 1984, as National Sanctity of Human Life Day. The proclamation came a little more than a decade after the landmark 1973 decision by the U.S. Supreme Court in the case of Roe v. Wade, which legalized abortion in all 50 states. Today, many churches still recognize the third Sunday in January as Sanctity of Human Life Sunday, which this year fell on January 16.

Last month, the Supreme Court heard oral arguments in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, a case that has the potential to reshape the legal landscape surrounding abortion. In 2018, Mississippi lawmakers passed legislation that limits elective abortions after 15 weeks of gestation. The state's only abortion provider, Jackson Women's Health Organization, challenged the law and lower courts have blocked it from taking effect. Mississippi appealed those rulings and now the nation's highest court will decide whether states can limit abortion before viability, which is around 24 weeks of gestation.

As we continue to pray for the decision in the *Dobbs v. Jackson* case which is expected later this year, what else can we do to advocate for the unborn? Many churches and individuals have a long history of being strong supporters of life, which is good, right and just.

We must continue such efforts that involve raising awareness about the issue and supporting pro-life policies and initiatives, but we must not stop there. What if more of our N.C. Baptist churches and their members got directly involved in seeking ways to serve and support those facing an unplanned or crisis pregnancy?

Local pregnancy resource centers across our state are in need of volunteers to provide compassion and care to women facing a crisis pregnancy. I'm thankful that many N.C. Baptist churches have partnered with these centers in a number of ways, but even more partners and volunteers are needed. To assist these centers in their life-saving work, your state convention staff is currently working to provide ultrasound machines to centers in two regions of our state.

There is also a tremendous need for individuals and families to love, serve, support, encourage and mentor mothers who are experiencing a crisis pregnancy. Such support can go a long way in helping a mother make the choice for life. And for mothers who do choose life, ongoing assistance is often needed in parenting or in placing newborn children into loving families through adoption. We cannot encourage an expectant mother to choose life but then leave her alone to figure things out. The easiest act in the world is to vote for elected officials who are pro-life, but followers of Jesus live pro-life by really helping others.

North Carolina Baptists, we have a tremendous gospel opportunity to not only be advocates for life but to also be actively involved in assisting those facing crisis pregnancies. What a great way for us to be on mission together.


