



Don't Be Cold-Blooded, Donate Blood

Who watches Shark Week on TV? We certainly do! Shark Week starts July 11th and ends July 18th. It's exciting and scary, but educational. Here are 5 interesting facts about sharks . . .

- 1. Sharks are important to the survival of our marine ecosystem. Sharks are at the top of the food chain. They eat fish, which helps to balance the food chain in our oceans.
- 2. Did you know sharks existed long before dinosaurs? Scientists believe they may have been around for over 400 million years!
- 3. A shark's sense of smell is similar to a human's, BUT it's 10,000 times stronger than ours! This is why a few drops of blood can draw sharks from miles away.
- 4. Three of the most common sharks are the great white, the hammerhead, and the blue shark.
- 5. There are approximately 500 species of sharks. More than 140 of these species are vulnerable and endangered.

You may be wondering, "What does this have to do with donating blood?" What if you were one of those unlucky people who got bitten by a shark and needed blood? I got your attention, didn't I? I'm sure all of us hope we never have a shark encounter. But, let's talk about donating blood. Our next Blood Drive is Tuesday, July 25th from 1:00 - 6:00 PM. Our goal is 37 pints of blood. A Power Red donation (or a double) is equal to two pints of blood. Every two seconds someone in the U.S. needs blood. That's why Rocky Hock Baptist Church is on a mission to help save lives by hosting a Blood Drive three times a year. Our church, the community, and surrounding areas are invited to take part in these special events. You can donate blood, volunteer, or do both! Donors can donate as young as age 16, as long as they meet certain criteria regarding height and weight, and have parental consent. Anyone is welcome to volunteer, including high school students. This experience looks great on college and scholarship applications.

The need for blood is constant. Donors can play a critical role in the treatment of accident and burn victims, heart surgery and transplant patients, and those receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer, and sickle cell patients. 
