"That which we have seen and heard, we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ." ~ 1 John 1:3

This text gives us a picture of what the church should be. John says that he has written this entire book so that the people reading it may have fellowship with Him. His purpose for the proclamation of the Gospel is for the sake of their fellowship. Is fellowship that important to you? Do you see fellowship as the reason you are proclaiming the Gospel? Or even the

reason that engagement in church is good or pleasing? John is writing with a different definition of fellowship than we usually work with. John then points out that his fellowship is not primarily with other people but with the Triune God. God has existed eternally in perfect fellowship. The Father loves the Son and the Spirit. The Son perfectly loves the Father and the Spirit. And the Spirit loves and glorifies the Father and the Son. They are perfectly unified and happy in their relationship with each other.

The Gospel is an invitation to join them in that fellowship. We are invited into the perfect, glorious, and eternal relationship in the Godhead. The closer we draw to God, the closer we get to the Father through the blood of Christ and the indwelling of the Spirit. But it is also the case that the closer we get to God, the closer we get to other believers who have also joined in the fellowship of the Trinity. The Gospel binds us to God and it binds us together. The more passionately we seek Christ, the more tightly we are bound to one another. So let us pursue the God who has pursued us by sending his only Son as a propitiation for our sins.

Oneness in Christ -Live in Love through Unity with Fellow Believers by Susan Lafferty

As missionaries serving with the International Mission Board, my family and I came back to the United States every few years for our stateside assignment. We looked forward to speaking in various churches and sharing with missions groups about how we'd seen God at work in our place of service.

My husband and I spoke to both large congregations with multiple services and small churches with few members. What never failed to inspire and encourage me was the fact that no matter the size, every congregation could take part in spreading the gospel to the ends of the earth. How? Through praying, giving, going, and sending.

The Cooperative Program of the Southern Baptist Convention collects offerings of various amounts from churches of all sizes. Combined, these offerings fund many different ministries that impact people around the world. When we give together, we can do much more than as individual congregations. We cooperate and seek unity in taking the good news to our communities, states, nation, and world.

The early church learned the importance of oneness for the sake of the gospel. With one heart and mind, believers joined their resources to provide for church members' needs.

Before Jesus went to the Cross, He had a final evening of teaching with His disciples. John 13-16 reveals what happened that night and what Jesus taught them.

John 17 records the prayer Jesus prayed that same evening for Himself, His disciples, and all believers. In His petition for all believers, He prayed "that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you" (v. 21). As we study Acts 4:32, we will see answers to His prayer as well as attempts to destroy that unity.

The immediate events leading up to our focal passage in Acts 4 were dramatic. Peter and John had healed a lame man in the name of Jesus. A crowd gathered and Peter began to preach the gospel. The two apostles were then arrested by the religious leaders for "teaching the people, proclaiming in Jesus the resurrection of the dead" (v. 2). Despite their arrest, many who heard the message believed.

When Peter and John were brought before the religious leaders, Peter again spoke the truth of the gospel. The leaders found it hard to bring a case against them, so they let them off with a warning, ordering the apostles not to speak or teach in the name of Jesus. But Peter responded courageously in the face of opposition. He assured them, "We cannot help speaking about what we have seen and heard" (v. 20).

Pray for believers who face opposition and persecution even as you read this. Pray they would have a holy boldness to seek the Lord and keep sharing the gospel with those wo have never heard.

Pray Philippians 2:1-5 for your church. Thank God for church unity, and pray He would expose any attempt of the enemy to destroy it.



RHBC's Annual Trunk or Treat


When: Saturday, October 28, 2023 from 6:00 - 8:00 PM
