The Week of Prayer for International Missions is a special, focused

time of prayer for Southern Baptist Missionaries serving through the

International Mission Board and the people they serve. I invite you to join

us in this season of prayer, December 3 - 10, 2023 for our missionaries and those they serve. Look for the 2023 Prayer Guide in your bulletin on Sunday, December 3rd.

Well over 100 years ago, a single missionary named Lottie Moon, while serving in China, began writing letters challenging the American churches to send and support more workers. After her death on the field, her challenge was heeded in the formalization of an offering in her name. Her life is a reminder of why we must give to send and support missionaries serving among unreached people in unreached places.

Lottie served 39 years as a missionary in China. She taught in a girl's school and often made trips into China's interior to share the Good News with women and girls. She also would bake cookies and invite women and girls to her home to share with them the Good News.

She gave herself completely to God, helping lay the foundation of what would become the Modern Chinese Church, one of the fastest growing Christian movements of the world. Lottie Moon died at age 72, ill and in declining health after ministering to her beloved Chinese.

In 1918, Women's Missionary Union (WMU) named the Annual Christmas Offering for International Missions after the woman who urged them to start it. Lottie saw first hand the world's greatest problem—lostness. Meeting so many people who had never heard the Gospel compelled her to write letters to American churches describing the need for greater missionary presence. She pleaded for increased prayer and financial support to send to sustain our missionaries. This challenge became known as **The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering**.

I encourage you to pray and support our international missionaries and the people they serve. Our Lottie Moon Offering will be collected on December 24, 2023. One hundred percent of your gifts support our missionaries and their work.






