"The Day I Threw My Class Ring into the Atlantic Ocean"

"Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy, To the only wise God our Savior, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen." ~ Jude 24-25

In this month's edition of *The Anchor*, I'd like to tell you about the time that I married my sister — to her husband Billy — and managed to lose my class ring in the process!

The year was 2014 and I was a Senior in High School. Lacei and her fiancé Billy had been dating for quite some time and our entire family liked him. So we were excited when we found out they were getting married! But we were even more excited to learn that they were getting married *at the beach*! Billy insisted on sweeping our entire family away to a fancy condo in North Myrtle Beach for a destination wedding vacation! To top it off, they asked me to officiate the wedding ceremony. I felt so honored.

In all, there were about 25-30 of us who made the trek. It was definitely a trip to remember! My cousins and I spent the whole week swimming in the pool, walking to the pier, making up random songs about baby palm trees, and eating home-cooked meals!

However, things would sadly take a turn for the worst. The day before the wedding, my cousin and I went down to the water to throw some football. And of course, just like any other time... I was wearing my class ring. This particular ring was very special to me; it was encrusted with diamonds (i.e., the cubic zirconium kind), rubies, and topaz, and was engraved with a special message from Jude 24 (my favorite scripture at the time). Little did I know, I was about to sling my ring into the Atlantic Ocean, never to be seen again.

I'll never forget the moment that it slipped off my finger. I had dropped back for the pass, and I threw the ball with all my might... and, there it went. There was nothing I could do but drop to my knees and blindly grapple around beneath the foaming waves; hoping and praying that it would find its way back home! But it never did. And while this was just a small blip on the radar of the week... it was still kind of a bummer!

Where am I going with this? I'm glad you asked. Any time I'm reminded of that fateful day in 2014... I don't think of what I lost. My mind is instead drawn to that special message that was engraved on the side of my ring. In times of uncertainly and loss, it always helps me put things into perspective. "Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy." (Jude 24)

Isn't it wonderful knowing that God is able to "keep us?" Amidst our disappointments, He keeps us! In our failures, He keeps us! In times of sadness and loss, He keeps us! In the midst of strife, He keeps us! When we're about to lose our minds, He keeps us. And, when everything is falling apart... He is the God "who is able to keep [us] from falling!"

Maybe you're having one of those days where everything seems like it's falling apart. You've experienced some kind of loss — be it a class ring or something else not eternal — and you're feeling a little sorry for yourself. Let me encourage you with the truth found in Jude 24… no matter what the situation may be, you serve a God who is totally in control, He's aware of your situation, and He's strong enough to *keep you*. And, the truth is, that's all that really matters!




