# "Pawpaw's Prayer List: Loud Snores & Whispered Prayers From Pawpaw's Big Ole Window"

"And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward. But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly." ~ Matthew 6:5-6

Born on a warm September evening in 1934, Jimmy Rogers — my Pawpaw — was the son of a preacher... and, for a while, he was a bit of a rebel! Before he met Jesus, he was known for running moonshine through the hills of Appalachia. But in 1954, at a Revival Service, everything changed! He got "born again," and traded the backroads for a Bible. For the next 65+ years, he never looked back.

Pawpaw had the opportunity to Pastor approximately 12 different churches — sometimes more than one at a time! But his ministry extended far beyond the sanctuary: He helped launch a Fire and Rescue Squad for a county that didn't have one, he started a local High School Football program (where he served as the first Head Coach), and even prayed at a Governor's Inauguration.

But Pawpaw's greatest witness wasn't in the spotlight — it was in the small moments at home. *He was just as faithful in his living room as he was in the pulpit.* Perhaps that's why I loved visiting as a kid. Pawpaw and Nana were real. Their home was a happy, Jesus-filled place — brimming with music, laughter, and an always-ready buffet of food. I would often spend the night with them and it was always a wonderful experience — except for that one night...

At 3 AM I was still wide awake — Pawpaw's snoring had reached seismic levels. Desperate, I called my parents and begged them to rescue me. They said, "No!" So I came up with a back-up plan. I crept into the "Florida Room" (our name for the cold, enclosed porch) hoping to find some peace and quiet. It was cold. It was dusty. And the only "bed" was a treadmill. But at least it was silent.

I must've dozed off, because the next thing I knew, I was awakened — not by the sound of snoring, but by the soft undertone of prayer. There was Pawpaw, seated by the window, Bible nearby, whispering names into the dawn. *Pawpaw always told us that he prayed over us daily and we believed him — but I never imagined I would have a front-row seat to his communion with God, inside his prayer closet*. His handwritten prayer list was pinned to the wall: family, church members, old friends — even folks who had wronged him. And he prayed for them all. Tenderly. Specifically.

That morning, I didn't move. I just listened, half-asleep. With the imprint of the treadmill still on my face and a runny nose from the cold, I realized something: The man we all saw at church and in the

community was the same man who prayed in secret at 6 AM in the quiet corners of his home, seeking God. I believe God let me witness that moment as a glimpse into what a real "prayer closet" looks like.

So what about you? Has someone else's faith ever encouraged you like this? Maybe without them even knowing it? If they're still around, *tell them*. And if they're not, thank God for putting them in your life when you needed them most.

# ENGAGE IN TELLING THE SPIRITUAL DISCIPLINE OF EVANGELISM

The word *discipline* either garners a good feeling in you or a feeling of dread depending on your experience with the word. Scripture talks about the importance of spiritual disciplines in the life of a Christian because they promote growth and conformity to the image of Christ.

While discipline of any kind requires work for some, the spiritual disciplines of Bible reading, prayer, and worship, for example, seem attainable and enjoyable. Other disciplines, like evangelism, may seem overwhelming, anxiety inducing, or meant for someone else—someone more suited. But all spiritual disciplines are for our good. They all help us live lives of faithfulness as we conform to the image of Christ. Sometimes we can all use a reminder of why evangelism is important, why we do what we do.

When Christ left the earth to go to His Father, He charged believers with this mandate: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19). Believers don't accidentally share the gospel with people. We must intentionally share it. If this thought causes angst in your heart because you don't feel prepared or equipped to share, here are some things to consider:

- 1. Evangelism is a call from Christ we are to obey (Matt. 28:18-20).
- 2. Evangelism is a discipline that must be practiced (1 Peter 3:15).
- 3. Evangelism is a charge to pray for the lost (Matt. 9:37-38).

Here are some practical ways to use the discipline of evangelism in your daily life:

- 1. Pray specifically that god would open doors for you to share Christ with others.
- 2. Practice sharing your personal faith story with family and friends, especially if nerves or fear is an issue.
- 3. Plan a time to share your faith story with neighbors or people in your community who are nonbelievers. Make a list of names of unsaved people you know. Look for gospel opportunities to invite them into your home for a meal and a time to get to know one another. These times should be both planned and spontaneous.

Make the discipline of evangelism a part of your life. Remember, God has called each one of us to share His message of love and forgiveness of sins to everyone who doesn't know Him. How did you come to know Christ as your Savior? Was it because someone took the time to share the gospel with you? Go and do likewise.
